THREE-YEAR BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAM

For motivated students seeking a well-rounded education, Bethany's three-year bachelor's degree program is an affordable option to achieve success.

Bethany College's three-year bachelor's degree program is a unique and exciting opportunity allowing qualified students to benefit from Bethany's strong liberal arts education, while saving a fourth year of college tuition and being able to enter the work force or attend graduate school a year earlier.

Students interested in the three-year program are encouraged to enter the program upon beginning study at Bethany. However, students may be accepted into the program during their first year, and students may transition to the regular four-year program if necessary.

High school 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale) and
22 ACT score/1030 SAT

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Complete a total of 124 credits in three years at Bethany
- Complete 15-17 credits in the fall and spring semesters, 3-4 credits over interterm sessions, and 6 credits during the summer sessions
- Advanced Placement (AP) credits are transferable

Mandatory summer classes take place during the months of June and July. Summer school students may stay in college housing and have meals in Pihlblad Memorial Union. Costs for each summer term from June 1 to July 1 are as follows:
